1	0	0	Zero odometer when exiting parking lot, --2896 S Eagle Rd, Newtown, PA 18940
2	0.1	0.1	Turn Right onto W Road
3	0.1	0	Turn left onto S Eagle Road
4	6.4	6.3	Continue on South Eagle until the dead end and turn left onto Lurgan Road
5	6.6	0.2	Turn right onto Van Sant Road
6	6.9	0.3	VAN SANT COVERED BRIDGE - Built in 1875, this bridge is 86 feet long and was one of two built across Pidcock Creek. The second, Neely Mill Bridge, was removed in 1937.
7	8.1	1.2	Left turn onto Aquetong Road
8	11.8	3.7	Left to Stay on Aquetong past the Stop Sign on PA-232
9	14.5	2.7	Left to Stay on Aquetong past the Stop Sign on PA-263
10	14.6	0.1	Turn left onto Carversville Road
11	14.7	0.1	Turn right onto Wismer Road
12	18.9	4.2	Continue on Wismer Road
13	19.8	0.9	Turn right onto Dark Hollow Road
14	19.8	0	Rest stop and for those who want to see the bridge may walk or drive down. Crossing Cabin Run Creek in Plumstead Township, this bridge stands 82 feet long and was built in 1871 by David Sutton, who built several bridges in the area. (REST STOP AREA)
15	19.8	0	Return to Dark Hollow Road
16	22.9	3.1	Stay Straight on Dark Hollow Road to Cafferty Road
17	23.5	0.6	Turn left to Cafferty Road follow until the end of the road.
18	23.6	0.1	Turn Right onto Hollow Horn Road then arrive at Frankenfield Covered Bridge. Built in 1872, Frankenfield Bridge spans 130 feet over Tinicum Creek, two miles upstream from the point at which the creek empties into the Delaware River.
19	24.3	0.7	Go through the bridge on Cafferty towards Hollow Horn Road
20	24.5	0.2	At the end of the road turn RIGHT onto Headquarter Road
21	25.8	1.3	Turn left onto Cafferty Road
22	28.8	3	Turn right onto Geigel Hill Road— Follow the road around the bend and stay to the left
23	29.1	0.3	Go through the stop sign to Erwinna Covered Bridges At only 56 feet long, Erwinna Bridge is the shortest covered bridge in the county. It was built in 1832 and is a good example of lattice-type construction.
24	29.4	0.3	Continue through the bridge Giegel Hill becomes Headquarters Road again
25	39	9.6	Turn left on PA-32/River Road— CROSS TRAFFIC DOES NOT STOP!
26	40.3	1.3	Turn right for PA 611 North to RT. 212/Durham Road and then turn left onto Route 212. We will re-group in the small to after making the right onto 611.
27	42.9	2.6	Turn left onto Lechenberg Road
28	44.1	1.2	Sharp Left to Stay on Lechenberg Road
29	44.4	0.3	Turn Left onto PA-412
30	46.2	1.8	Turn right on Silfer Valley Road
31	48	1.8	Turn left to Knecht Bridge Road
34	48	0	Turn left for Kenechts Covered Bridge. Located in Slifer Valley Knecht's Bridge was built of hemlock and is set on the route of the Penn family's famous Walking Purchase.
35	49.6	1.6	Follow through the bridge and onto Township Road
36	50.7	1.1	Turn right onto PA-212
37	51.3	0.6	Keep left onto Old Bethlehem Rd
38	54.8	3.5	Turn right onto PA-412- Tavern is on the left we are parking in a lot around the corner.
